




### **Driving Directions:**




# So What is Happening in the CLIA Program?

Speaker: Francisca L. Lehr, MS, MT (ASCP)

This session is a practical review of the CLIA Quality Systems Requirements. The presenter will lay out a simple approach to the CLIA requirements and how one can apply them in the laboratory. The proficiency testing requirements are revised and the presenter will discuss the revision in layman's term. A new quality control option, Individualized Quality Control Plan (IQCP) became effective on January 1, 2016, the presenter will outline a practical approach in writing an IQCP. The presenter will share an easy guide and or checklist to ensure your IQCP meets CLIA. A discussion of the top ten (10) deficiencies cited in Idaho and how it compares deficiencies nationwide. The session is for laboratory directors and laboratorians in hospitals, physicians' office labs (POLs), clinics, and other entities doing nonwaived testing.




# Trauma-Induced Coagulopathy and Massive Transfusion Protocol

### JONATHANPR DEVANE, PA-C.






### PAUL JEASTVOLD, MD. MT(ASCP)

### CRACHEL HULSE, MS. MLS(ASCP)



### MONETN. SAYEGH, M.D.



### DAVID F. SCHAFFNER, PH.D. MT(ASCP)



### DIANER. STUMPF, MIS(ASCP)






