- A. **President** is IDSCLS Chief Executive and Board of Directors Chairperson, a member of the IDSCLS President's Council, IDSCLS House of Delegates and Region VIII Council, is Chairperson of the Liaison Committee and ex-officio member of all committees except Nomination and Elections Committee, appoints standing committees, and executes other customary duties defined by Parlimentary Law.
- B. **President-elect** is the vice chairman of the Board of Directors and acts as the chief executive in the President's absence; is a member of the President's Council, House of Delegates and Region VIII Council; is a member of the Liaison Committee and Scholarship Board of IDSCLS; becomes familiar with the President's duties in order to take over that position. Pre-requisite; Society membership for one year.
- C. **Secretary** keeps minutes of all the meetings of the membership and Board of Directors of the IDSCLS and maintains a current file; conducts requested correspondence; notifies Board Members at least ten days prior to the Board Meeting; keeps rolls at Board Meetings.
- D. **Treasurer** collects, receives, accurately records and has charge of all funds of the Society; deposits all funds in a bank designated by the Board of Directors; reports the financial condition of the Society as requested by the President at each Board Meeting.
- E. **Editor** is responsible for the publication and distribution of the official Society Newsletter, serves on the Awards Board.
- F. **Editor-elect** assists the Editor and prepares to take over those duties.
- G. **Board member** duties are delegated by the President, serves as a consultant to the President of Board of Directors issues.

Meet one of our newest IDSCLS members. Steven Graf graduated last June from the medical technology program at Idaho State University, and is currently working at Minidoka Memorial Hospital in Rupert. The workload in the laboratory maintains all workers in the "generalist" category, as testing is performed for the 24-bed acute care facility and attached 78-bed nursing home facility.

Steven says he "loves the work", being able to practice his skills in all the laboratory disciplines, and working with a great group of people. How did he come to work in Idaho? Steven's family moved to Heyburn from McAllen, Texas, during his senior year of high school, and he graduated from Minidoka High. College days took him first to CSI in Twin Falls, where he received an Associate Degree in Natural Science. One of his favorite courses there was microbiology -- he found he enjoyed looking at things growing on the culture media and the investigative work of identifying them. When his advisor heard that Steven enjoyed working in the lab, he told him about other areas involved in laboratory science, and how he could make a career of that, or even use that education as a stepping stone to pursue other medical interests later if he so desired. The decision was made, and Steven was off to study at ISU. His training at the university, and his internships at Gooding Memorial and Cassia Regional Medical Center in Burley, convinced him he'd made the right decision.

Steven enjoys the "hands on work", as well as his extra responsibility of being a "job shadow supervisor". The health profession class from high school has about 20 students who spend 4 hours each in the laboratory, and lab supervisor Ann Lee Owens says Steven is good at explaining to them what the lab does, as well as answering their questions and letting them know how they, too, can pursue a career in laboratory sciences. Steven says this association has really made him realize how little the general public knows about what we do in the lab. He thinks one of the important things that ASCLS and IDSCLS should be doing is finding a way to bring recognition of what we do to the rest of the community.

When Steven is away from the hospital, he enjoys spending time with his wife and 2-year-old daughter. There are also lots of aunts, uncles, & cousins in the area to join him in activities outdoors, particularly fishing – bass fishing is his favorite.
